

Continuing Application & Statement of Commitment Cohort 3 November 2021-April 2023

The Children's Safety Network, in cooperation with the Health Resources and Services Administration's (HRSA) Maternal and Child Health Bureau (MCHB), is launching the third cohort of the Child Safety Learning Collaborative to reduce fatal and serious injuries among infants, children, and adolescents. The third cohort will begin in November 2021 and continue for 18 months to April 2023.

Interested states and jurisdictions *currently participating in Cohort 3* must submit the abbreviated application to csninfo@edc.org by Friday August 20, 5:00 PM Eastern Time. The statement of commitment should be signed by the state/jurisdiction Maternal and Child Health Director, Injury and Violence Prevention Director, and an individual of the state's/jurisdiction's choosing whose leadership is considered essential to success in the Learning Collaborative.

Participation in Cohort 3 of the CSLC

Just as in prior cohorts, participation in Cohort 3 of the CSLC is self-initiated and is not a requirement for Title V Block grantees. Applicants must be representatives of a Title V state/jurisdiction agency, though other state agencies and community organizations are encouraged to partner with the Title V agency and join the Learning Collaborative.

To be eligible to continue into the third cohort of the CSLC, states and jurisdictions must submit the signed statement of commitment, which appears at the end of this document. Continuing states and jurisdictions are encouraged to continue with their current topics and/or expand into an additional topic.

Benefits of Committing to and Participating in Cohort 3

By applying to participate in Cohort 3, your state/jurisdiction has the opportunity to:

- Continue participation in a national network of peers who will share lessons learned and resources, conquer challenges, and implement and spread evidence-driven strategies and programs to prevent child fatalities and injuries;
- Serve as a mentor to new states, jurisdictions, and tribal communities that will be joining Cohort 3;
- Serve as presenters or contributors to CSN's ongoing work to promote Quality Improvement and child safety;
- Participate in ongoing trainings, personalized coaching, and technical assistance from nationally renowned content experts to support and guide your program improvement efforts;
- Build your capacity to establish a sustainable child safety system of improvement in your state/jurisdiction; and
- Access CSLC materials, including new strategy resources, project planning, data collection tools and personalized technical assistance.

Responsibilities and Expectations of Cohort 3 Participants

States and jurisdictions that participate in Cohort 3 are expected to:

- Have <u>new</u> Strategy Team(s) and any <u>new</u> members participate in a Learning Collaborative
 Welcome/Orientation Webinar, which will be offered twice: (1) Tuesday, September 28 from 3:00 PM to
 4:00 PM Eastern Time or (2) Thursday, September 30 from 1:00 PM to 2:00PM Eastern Time;
- Participate in a 2-day <u>on-line</u> Learning Session on November 9 and 10. Each day will be scheduled for 2-3 hours:
- Participate in <u>monthly online meetings</u> to provide updates on state/jurisdiction work, receive live technical assistance, and share strategies and resources with other state/jurisdiction Strategy Teams, beginning in December 2021;
- Utilize quality improvement approaches and tools to drive change at the state/jurisdiction, community, and local levels. Approaches and tools will be taught and supported through the Learning Collaborative, including systems maps, 30-, 60-, and 90-day aim statements and Plan-Do-Study-Act (PDSA) cycles; and
- Submit monthly data and narrative reports to demonstrate the work and progress of your Strategy Team(s).
