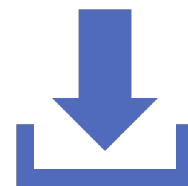

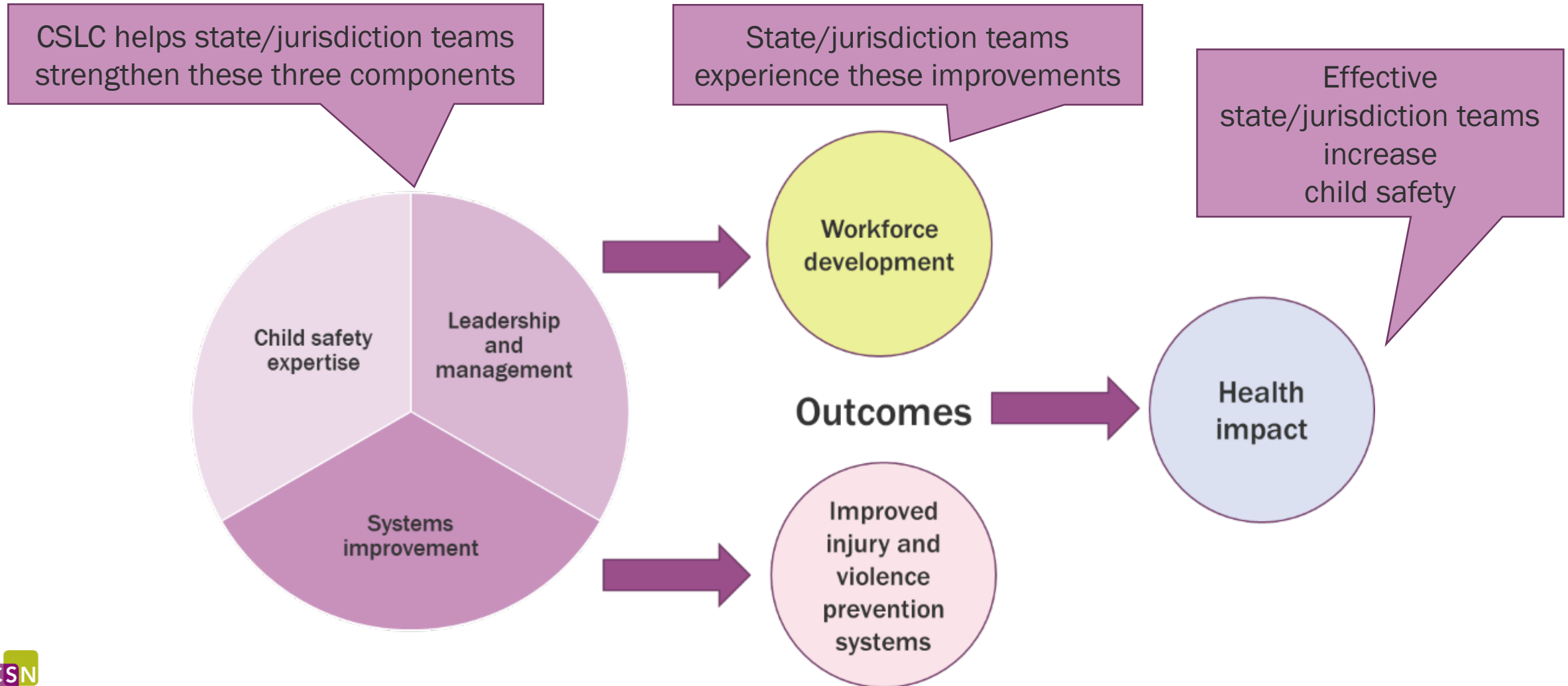
CSLC Vision

Reduce fatal and serious injuries among infants, children, and adolescents in participating states and jurisdictions by:

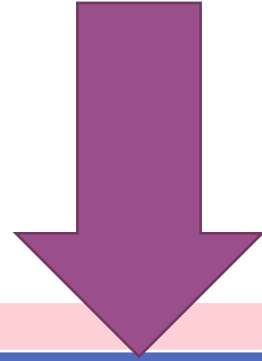
- Building and improving partnerships

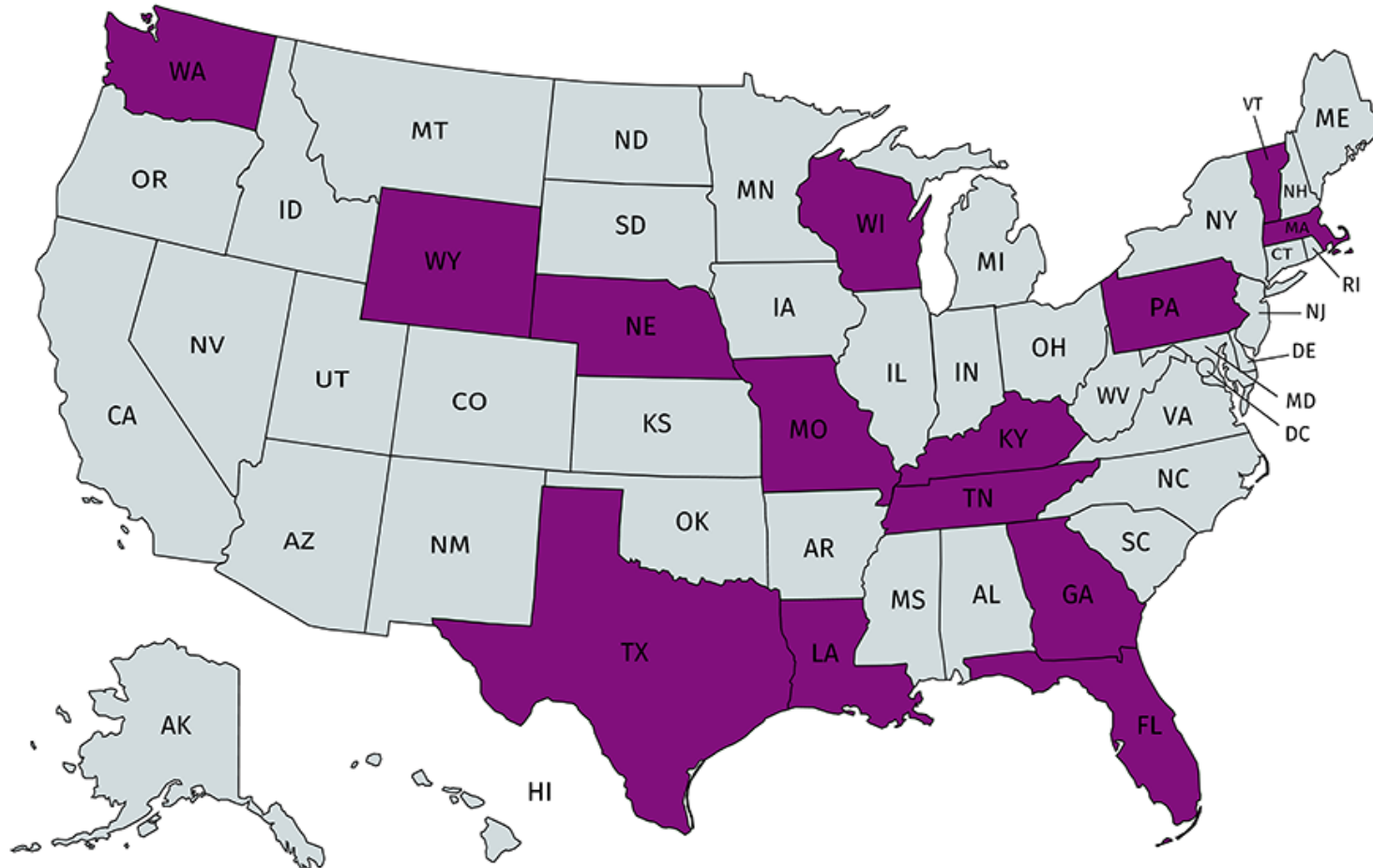


CSLC Support

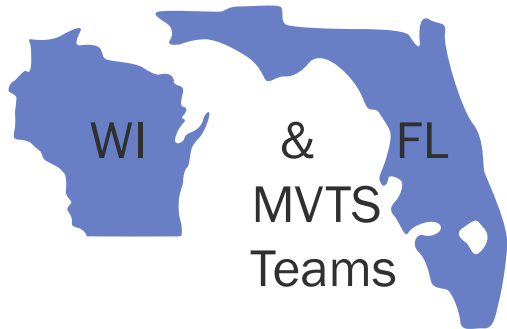

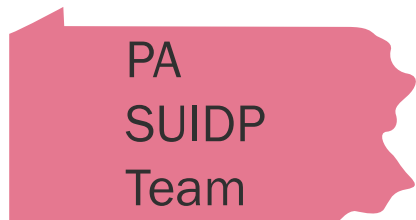
Converted QPR (Question/Persuasion/Response) gatekeeper training

CSLC Resilience

Creating new methods and procedures to convert face-to-face activities to COVID-19 parameters



Converted to curbside car seat distribution and use of video for seat installation training/instruction



Adapting outreach and training for new hospitals joining safe sleep network and creating a website resource to supplement in-hospital education for parents

CSLC Resilience

Adjusting strategies and focus in response to disruptions



Due to COVID and schools not conducting Teens in the Driver Seat, turned their focus to providing virtual opportunities for drivers' education, getting graduated driver's licensing law information incorporated into the DMV Driver Education Curriculum Standards, and creating a survey to understand how law enforcement communicates information around traffic safety



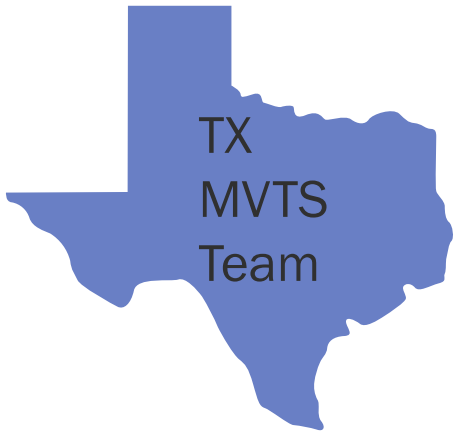
Due to the impact of COVID and hurricane on partnerships, shifted from valid and reliable suicide risk screening tools in schools and healthcare settings to virtual gatekeeper trainings

Diverse Partnerships



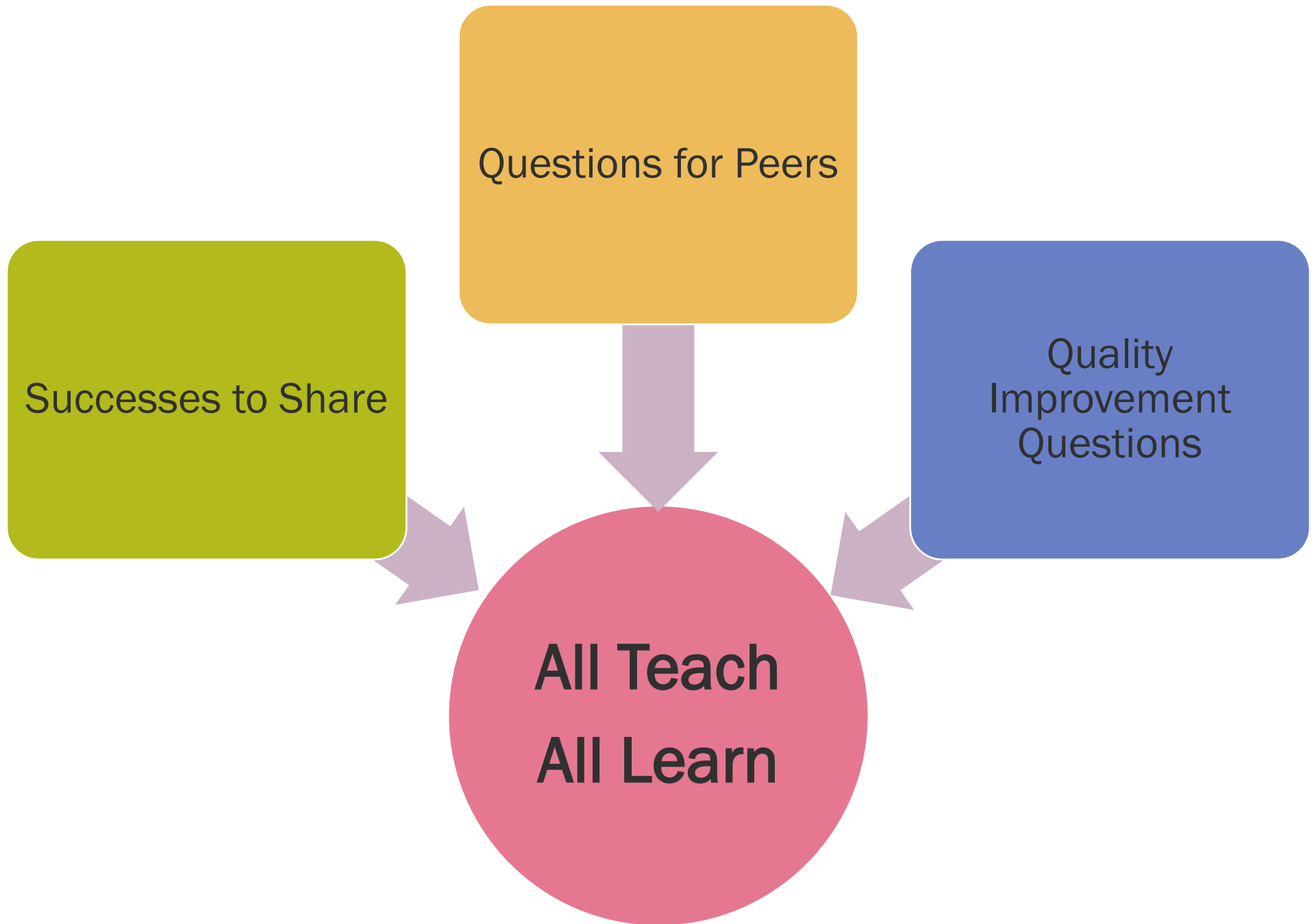
Launched a youth advisory board to ensure efforts in SSHP and teen driver safety meet community needs



Worked with their car seat distribution funder to adjust criteria in response to changing circumstances due to COVID

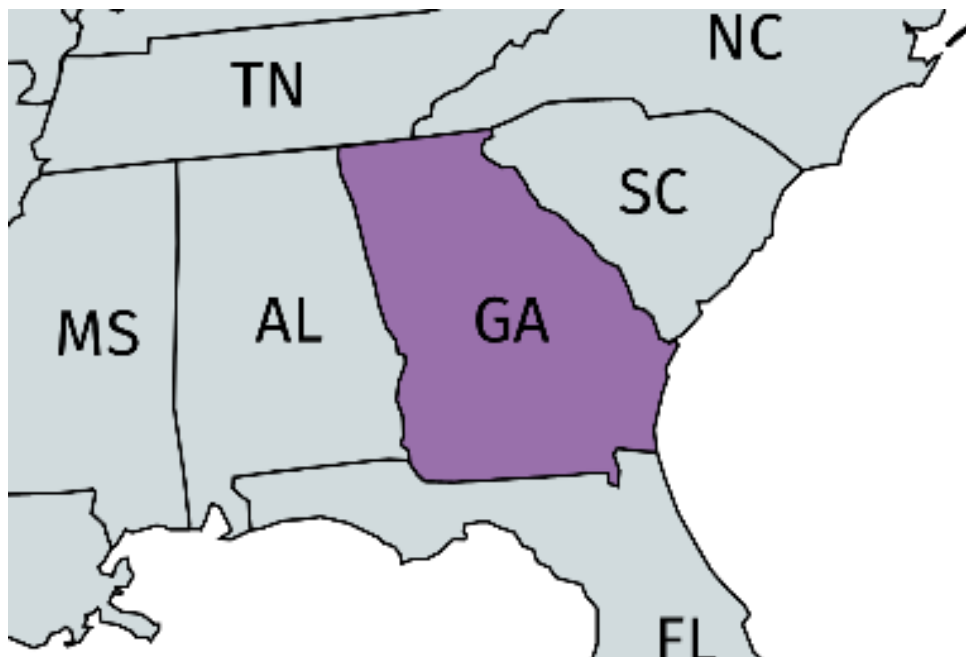
