


Unintentional Motor Vehicle Traffic Fatalities Data

Unintentional motor vehicle traffic injury is the leading cause of injury death for children and adolescents ages 0-19 years (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention [CDC] WISQARS, 2019). The national average for unintentional motor vehicle traffic death rate was 4.4 per 100,000 children and adolescents in 2016-2019. Statistical comparisons of national and state rates showed:

- 23 states were significantly above the national rate
- 11 states were at the national rate
- 16 states and District of Columbia were significantly below the national rate
